Price charts speak a language of their own—and successful traders know how to read it. In this guide, you'll learn **12 must-know chart patterns** that reveal market psychology, signal potential buy or sell opportunities, and help you move from confusion to confident, professional-level decision making.

### 1. Hammer

**Simple Meaning: A single candle with a small body at the top and long lower wick – like a hammer hitting the floor. Shows price fell but buyers pushed it back up strongly**

### What a Hammer Looks Like

A Hammer forms **after a decline** and has these characteristics:

1. **Small real body**
  - Body is near the **top of the candle**
  - Colour can be **green or red** (green is slightly stronger)
2. **Long lower shadow**
  - At least **2× the size of the real body**
3. **Very small or no upper shadow**

Visually, it looks like a **hammer or pin** 



## Market Psychology Behind the Hammer

Price opens and **sellers push it sharply lower**

- Buyers step in aggressively
- Price recovers and **closes near the high**
- This shows **rejection of lower prices**

➔ Sellers lose control, buyers show strength.

## When the Hammer Is Valid

**A Hammer is meaningful only if:**

- It appears **after a downtrend**

- It forms near:
  - Support zone
  - Demand zone
  - 20/50 EMA
  - Previous swing low

A Hammer in the middle of an uptrend or sideways market has **low reliability**.

## Confirmation (Very Important)

Do **not** trade the Hammer alone.

### A valid confirmation is:

- Next candle closes above the Hammer's high
- OR strong bullish volume on the next candle

## Trading Setup (Simple & Practical)

## 2. Bullish Engulfing

- Small **bearish (red)** candle
- Continues the existing downtrend

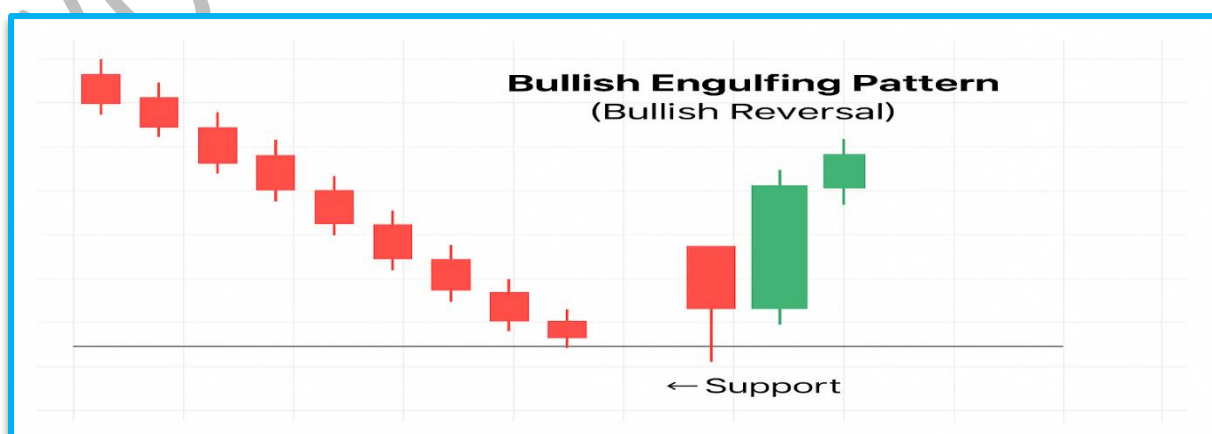
#### 2. Second candle:

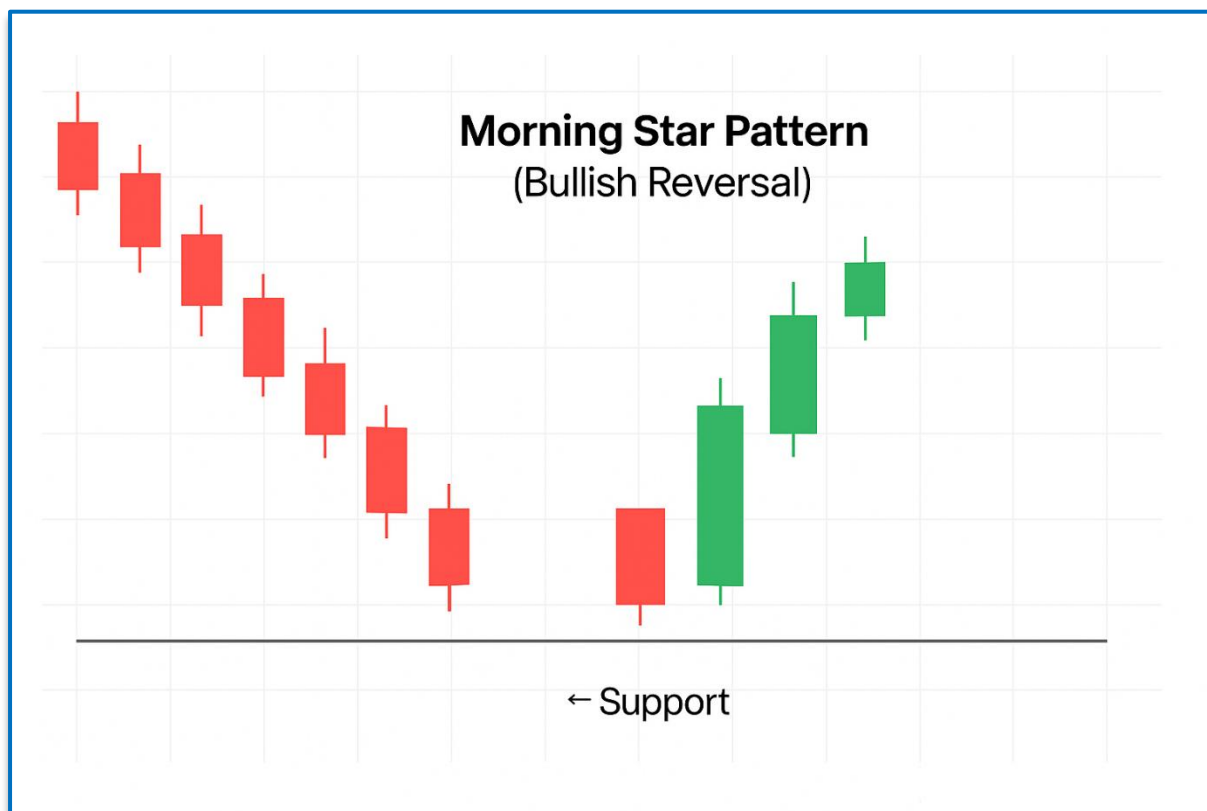

  - Closes **well into the body of the first bearish candle**

👉 Selling momentum slows down, and buyers start taking control.

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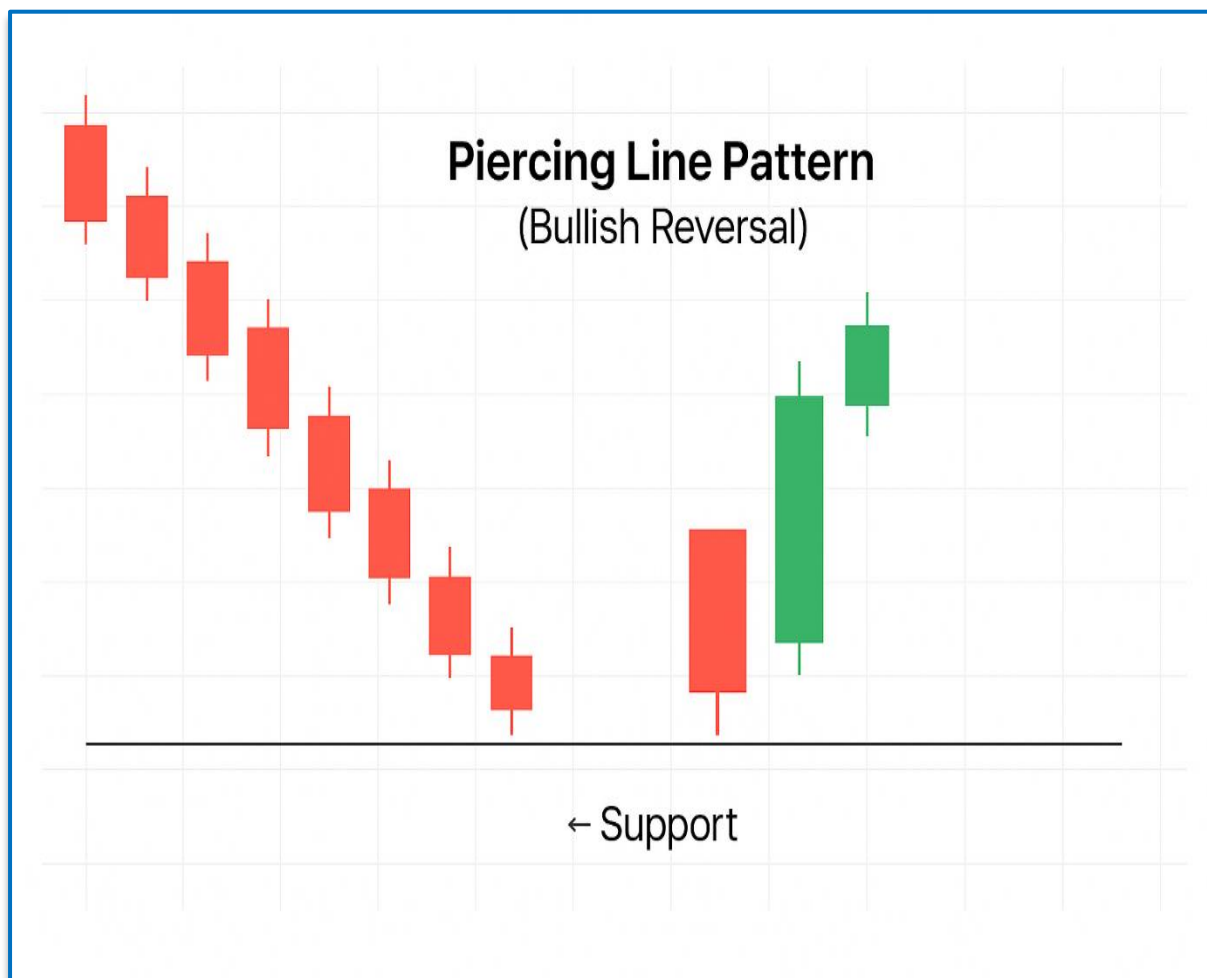

This pattern reflects **controlled accumulation by strong buyers**, not a sudden spike.

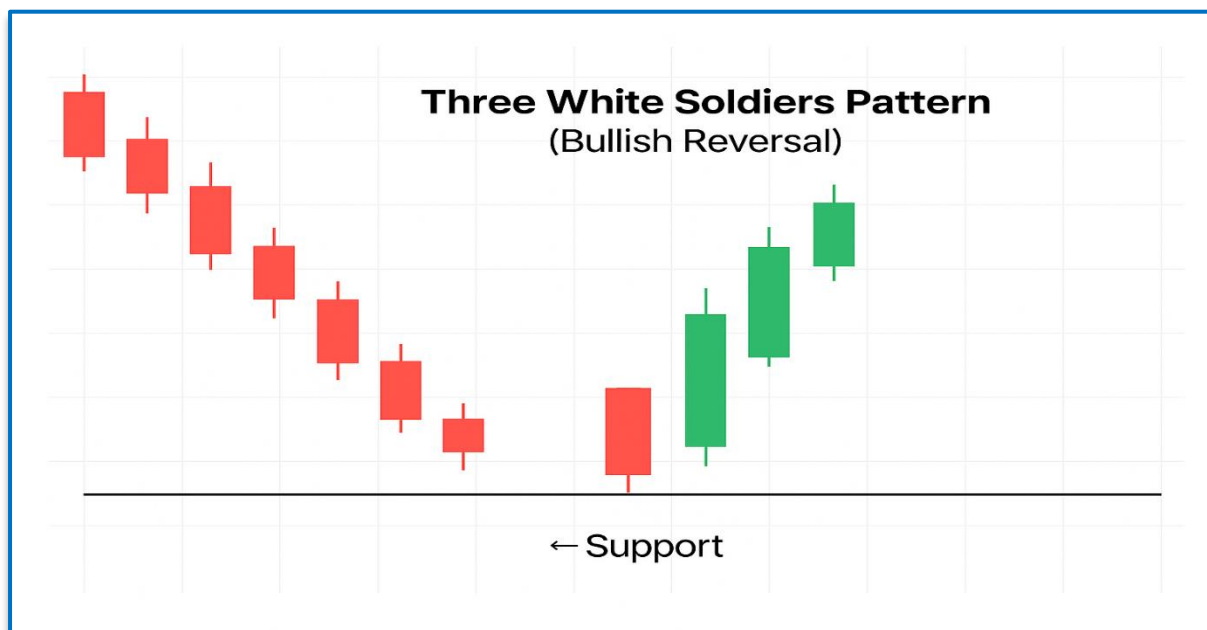
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### What Three White Soldiers Looks Like

- A **small bullish (green) candle**
- Opens and closes **completely within the body** of the first bearish candle
- Indicates reduced selling momentum

Key idea:

👉 The second candle is “inside” the first candle’s body.

## Bearish Harami Pattern (Potential Bearish Reversal)



## Market Psychology Behind Bullish Harami

This pattern reflects **weakening bearish control**.

- The market is in a **downtrend**
- Sellers dominate during the first candle
- Selling pressure slows down
- Smart money begins **buying quietly**
- Retail sellers lose confidence
- Price stabilizes instead of falling further

This tells us:

 *Sellers are losing strength; buyers are testing control.*

## When the Bullish Harami Is Valid

Bullish Harami works best at **important market locations**.

High-probability conditions:

- Near a **strong support level**
- Inside a **demand zone or order block**
- After a **sharp or extended decline**
- After a **liquidity sweep below lows**
- With **RSI bullish divergence** (optional)

✗ Avoid trading Bullish Harami in sideways markets without context.

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## Confirmation Is Critical

Bullish Harami is a **warning signal**, not an entry by itself.

Look for confirmation such as:

- The **next candle closing bullish**
- Break above the **high of the Harami candle**
- Increase in **buying volume**
- Price holding above **support**

Confirmation separates **real reversals from traps**.

## Trading Setup (Simple & Practical)

### Entry:

- Buy above the **high of the second (bullish) candle**
- Conservative traders wait for **next candle confirmation**

### Stop Loss:

- Below the **low of the pattern**
- Or below the **support / demand zone**

### Target:

- Nearest **resistance level**
- Or use **1:2 or 1:3 risk-reward**
- Trail stop if price gains strength

## Important Trading Tip

Bullish Harami is a **slow-building pattern**, not meant for aggressive entries.

Always combine it with:

## 12.Three Black Crows Chart Pattern

The **Three Black Crows** is a powerful **bearish reversal chart pattern** that usually appears after an uptrend. It signals **strong and sustained selling pressure** and often marks the **start of a new downtrend**, not just a small correction.

This is a **three-candle pattern** that reflects clear dominance by sellers.

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### What Three Black Crows Looks Like

The Three Black Crows pattern consists of **three consecutive bearish candles**:

- 1. First candle:**
  - A strong **bearish (red)** candle appearing near the top of an uptrend
- 2. Second candle:**
  - Opens **within the body** of the first candle
  - Closes lower, showing follow-through selling
- 3. Third candle:**
  - Opens **within the body** of the second candle
  - Closes even lower, confirming selling control

Each candle typically has **small or no lower wicks**, showing **steady, controlled selling**.

## Three Black Crows Pattern (Strong Bearish Reversal)



### Market Psychology Behind Three Black Crows

This pattern represents **distribution by smart money**.

- The market is in an **uptrend**
- Buyers are confident and fully invested
- Big players start selling positions gradually
- Selling pressure increases day after day
- Buyers fail to push prices higher
- Panic selling begins

This shows:

🚩 *Sellers have taken full control, and the trend is reversing.*

## When the Three Black Crows Is Valid

Three Black Crows works best when it forms at **important resistance areas**.

High-probability conditions:

- Near a **strong resistance level**
- Inside a **supply zone or order block**
- After an **extended rally**
- After a **liquidity sweep above highs**
- With increasing **volume across all three candles**

✗ Avoid trading it after a prolonged downtrend.

---

## Confirmation Is Important

Even strong patterns require confirmation.

Look for:

- A **fourth candle** continuing downward
- Price staying below the **third candle's high**
- Break of **nearby support levels**
- Strong or rising **selling volume**

Confirmation ensures the move is **not short-term profit booking**.

---

## Trading Setup (Simple & Practical)

### Entry:

- Sell below the **low of the third candle**
- Conservative traders wait for a **small pullback**

### Stop Loss:

- Above the **high of the first or second candle**
- Or above the **resistance / supply zone**

### Target:

- Nearest **support zone**
- Or use **1:2 or 1:3 risk-reward**
- Trail stop as the trend develops

---

## Important Trading Tip

Three Black Crows is a **high-confidence bearish signal**, but very large candles may indicate **short-term exhaustion**.

### Always combine it with:

- Support & resistance
- Market structure
- Volume analysis
- Risk management

## Quick Pattern Scanner Checklist

Use this 5-second check before every trade:

- **Volume High?** (Pattern stronger with rising volume)
- **At Support/Resistance?** (Timing perfect)

- **Stop Loss Ready?** (Below/above pattern low/high)
- **Risk-Reward 1:2?** (Risk ₹1 to make ₹2 min)

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## Pro Trading Rules for Patterns

- **Never trade alone** – Combine with trend, support, RSI.
- **False signals kill** – Always wait for confirmation candle.
- **Risk first** – Never risk more than 1% of capital per trade.
- **Practice free** – Mark these on Trading View historical charts daily.
